Colonel Ryan Schrock enlisted in the Army in 1994 as a Military Policeman in the 2d, 24th and 3rd Infantry Divisions as a patrol dog handler.

Receiving his commission from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 2001, he served as a Stinger Missile Platoon Leader, Sentinel Radar Platoon Leader and Battery Executive Officer in the 2d Battalion, 44th Air Defense Artillery Regiment at Fort Campbell, Kentucky and in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF).
